Reporting involves providing a formal account or statement of what happened.

You can make an **anonymous**report to Safer Community
online, however it may limit
our ability to respond, because
we cannot contact you for
further information. We also
cannot update you about any
action taken.

**Disclose** your experience to talk about your options for support and reporting.

When you disclose or report sexual harm to Safer Community, the University may be required to investigate and take actions to protect the safety of the community

Regardless of whether you choose to make a formal report to the University or to Police, your safety and wellbeing is our priority. You can continue to access University support and safety services while you continue to study at La Trobe.
